#### d) Report for engineers / LRP team

Engineer Bill Baudendistel explained that the Ameren fencing has been approved and is being installed.

Engineer Paul Homann stated that the sidewalk design is completed and they are waiting for easement/right of way from Cargill and Casino Queen, so work can begin.

Kristy with Arcutris presented the board with the top 10 projects from each county.

Feedback from presentation went as follows:

The team's top 10 priority recommendations selected from the priority projects submitted by the municipalities were accepted by the board for further study, feasibility and evaluation for inclusion in the long range master plan. It was agreed to avoid on street connections as much as possible. Arcturis will continue to evaluate all of the recommended trails or close alternatives and also identify where acquisitions will be required for completion of recommended trails.

<u>A1 – Alton Bike Bath/MCT Confluence/Vadalbene Trail</u> (3 miles). Continue to study the portion between Riverfront Park and Piasa Park and look for the best solution with the least amount of street trail.

<u>B1 – Highland Connector Trail US RT 40</u> (13 miles) Continue to evaluate the Route 40 option. There is a significant right-of-way south of 40. Consider where the largest population growth occurs and how the trail will allow access.

<u>C2 – Bethalto Bikeway</u> (5 miles). Ultimate desire is to connect to the Gordon F. Moore Community Park. Bethalto controls the majority of the ownership. One private owner has interest in allowing the trail to go through their development. There is a current easement under Interstate 255. Evaluate whether the trail can follow the creek south rather than straight through the neighborhood.

<u>E1 – Pontoon Beach Connector</u> (6 miles), Understand from the agency why they have chosen the route to be submitted trail. This is a major connection opportunity; find the best way to connect the MCT Nature Trail and MCT Schoolhouse Trail to the MCT Confluence Trail. Dobrey Slough drainage way is a possible route.

<u>F2 – Arlington/Mounds Connector</u> (4 miles) Rename the trail to the new public park name opposed to the Arlington Greens Golf Course and connect to the new park rather than the golf course.

<u>H1 – Longacre Corridor</u> (6 miles). Evaluate the old rail access option rather than the on street option. Verify St. Ellen Park Trail is paved.

<u>G2/G3/G4 – Bicentennial/Citizens/Belleville/Memorial Corridor (</u>5 miles). Lyndon is working with the city of Belleville to adjust the alignment near Althoff's Catholic School and Memorial Hospital Campus. This will be included in the final recommendations.

N4/I1 – Engle Creek/College Road Trail (8 miles) No notes

<u>M2/M3/M4/M5 – Schranz/Old Collinsville/Huntwood Road</u> Trails (4 miles). M2 is probably the most feasible as the first section. Review the possibility of following Richland Creek.

<u>P1/Q1 – Silver Creek Trail – Mascoutah</u> (5 miles). The creek bed floods frequently. Review the potential use of the elevated trestle and the location and connection to Silver Creek Reserve.
